### New book:



Georg A. Weth: "Ick will wat Feinet". Das Marlene Dietrich Kochbuch. 167 p., 29,90 DM; Rütten & Loening, Berlin 2001.

This is a Marlene cookbook with a lot of recipes - most of them by a cook who used to run the "Maison d'Allemagne" in Paris. Marlene ordered german dishes and the cook brought them to her apartment. If you are interested in the cook's conversation with Marlene this is a book for you. The recipes are also taken from "Marlenes ABC" and her personal cookbooks. Generally it is Germany's good plain cooking. The book looks real nice on the outside but the printing quality of the photos is rather poor.

## New DVD:

The german version of the famous film. You can select english and french subtitles. Poor bonus material: filmographies of Marlene (including wrongly again „Street without joy“) and Josef von Sternberg and a short biography on Marlene in french.

Picture quality is good, but the aspect ratio is wrong. The aspect ratio for early sound film is 1,19 which means that you have a blank space on the TV set on the left and on the right side if you get to see the full height of the frame. With this edition you have no blank space which again means that there is always something missing at the upper side of the frame. There are also freeze frames and the sound quality is rather poor.
